Hope to see you there!



There are a couple of things that needs attention.

- 1. A computer monitor has been donated!
- 2. Our club website is comprised of a lot of different modules (plug-ins) written by different companies. I created the website about 5 years ago using free plug-ins.


However, over the years, there is one company that has started charging for their plug-in. This plug-in is the Paid Membership Pro. This plug-in allows people to have unrestricted access to the members only section and allows members to use PayPal to create or renew their account instantly. The version of the plug-in we have will continue to be free. We have not lost any functionality. However, this plug-in is 5 years old and needs to be updated. There has been a lot of security added and updates since we started using it. There are several more functions in this plug-in that we could advantage of.

There are quite a few members that either do not live here or not able to attend meetings but still supports the club by paying dues via PayPal.

This is a very critical function of our website. The plugin is regular \$340. They have promotions from time to time for around \$240. I suspect they may have another promotion around Thanksgiving or Christmas.

Since this is a new cost to the club, this needs to be voted on at the next meeting.

This is separate from the website hosting which is paid every 2 years. The webhosting will be due in March at \$240. I believe David Glenn mention this in the September Meeting and was passed by the club.
