That morning, we will have a presentation reviewing the high impact weather events for our area in 2020 and we will also recognize the 2020 Skywarn Spotter of the Year (2019 Spotter of the Year- Steven Carter, Haworth, OK). Please pass this along to any Skywarn Spotters and HAMs within your network.

If you plan to attend, you must first register at: Skywarn Recognition Day Registration by Tuesday, December 1st. The GoogleMeet information will be shared with registrants on December 2nd.

Nationwide Red Cross Emergency Communications Drill, Joint Exercise with ARES

The Nationwide Red Cross Emergency
Communications Fall Drill is a joint exercise with
ARES set for November 14, an evolution of the
highly successful Spring Drill that had hundreds
of participants from some 40 states and Puerto
Rico.

The Fall Drill will be a Winlink-specific event with the following goals: (1) pass traditional Red Cross (ARC) forms from as many states and as many radio amateurs as possible to one of six Divisional Clearinghouses, and (2) bring as many radio operators as possible up to a "basic" level of Winlink proficiency. To prepare, there is a twelve-week series of Winlink Workshops held each Thursday at 0100Z on Zoom. (Actual local time is Wenesday, 7:00pm!! We are 6 hours behind Zulu time.)

Join the <u>SEC-ARES group</u> for announcements and discussions. Include your name and call sign when registering on SEC-ARES.

Winlink Proficiency Goals have been written, a Winlink Technical Support Team has been formed, and Metrics for Drill Success have been developed. The proficiency goals are established as a training guideline and references online

training resources. Many hams new to Winlink should find these resources helpful.

Over 300 radio amateurs have signed up for the event and more than a hundred were on a Briefing Call on October 5. There will be one other Briefing Call, in early November. This event is open to all radio amateurs; if interested in more information, contact Mike Walters, W8ZY, for ARES-related questions or Wayne Robertson, K4WK, for Red Cross-related topics.

There are a couple of things that needs attention.

- 1. A computer monitor has been donated!
- 2. Our club website is comprised of a lot of different modules (plug-ins) written by different companies. I created the website about 5 years ago using free plug-ins.


However, over the years, there is one company that has started charging for their plug-in. This plug-in is the Paid Membership Pro. This plug-in allows people to have unrestricted access to the members only section and allows members to use PayPal to create or renew their account instantly. The version of the plug-in we have will continue to be free. We have not lost any functionality. However, this plug-in is 5 years old and needs to be updated. There has been a lot of security added and updates since we started using it. There are several more functions in this plug-in that we could advantage of.

There are quite a few members that either do not live here or not able to attend meetings but still supports the club by paying dues via PayPal.

This is a very critical function of our website. The plugin is regular \$340. They have promotions from time to time for around \$240. I suspect they may have another promotion around Thanksgiving or Christmas.

Since this is a new cost to the club, this needs to be voted on at the next meeting.

This is separate from the website hosting which is paid every 2 years. The webhosting will be due in March at \$240. I believe David Glenn mention this in the September Meeting and was passed by the club.



FCC Wants to Re-instate Fees

What used to be free, the FCC is now proposing a \$50 fee for Technician, General or Extra upgrade. This is on top of the ARRL fee of \$15. ARRL strongly recommends filing a complaint with FCC. To file a complaint go here.
