

They have donated over \$115 to the club so far.




Ark La Tex Challenge

As you may know, the bike ride starts at Liberty Eyelau High School and rides to the LA line and returns. Cell phones are very sketchy along this route and as well has radio repeaters. Hand held radios do not work. Mobile radios on Full power work better. If a rider needs assistance whether it be medical or otherwise, a radio is the only way to gain help.

There will be several trucks, known as SAG, that are used to follow riders and assist as needed. We need coverage in a couple of areas. Radio operators will ride along in the SAG trucks. Make sure your mobile radio can plug into the truck cigarette lighter. Don't forget the mobile antenna! Also radio operators are also needed at the various check points along the route. As we head into our primary severe weather season, we want to make sure you are aware of some of the resources out there to help you make weather-related decisions.

IDSS Forecast Point

Page (www.weather.gov/forecastpoints)

At this link, you can get forecast information for a user identified point anywhere in your county or parish on a day-by-day, hour-by-hour basis. The interface is pretty self-explanatory, but you can get a world of forecast information for your location with just a few

clicks. This is a great tool if you have outdoor activities and would like to know when the best chances for rain are during the day/night along with specific temperature information during a specified timeframe.

Graphical Hazardous Weather Outlook

This *experimental* page is a decision support service for your situational awareness that supports preparedness and response efforts prior to and during hazardous weather. This service provides decision makers with convenient access to potential weather hazard information by graphically depicting the risk of weather hazards out through seven days.
